

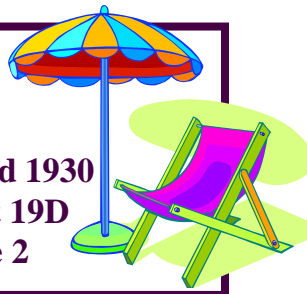

completed. The renovation work is to install new lights. It is also getting a 40” door for a person with a dog or in a wheelchair. The wish list that you have seen in the newsletter is coming along well. They have gotten grants from Home Depot, the carpenter’s union is framing for free, volunteers are painting and a local company is doing the electrical work. Things are moving along nicely.

Caroline is the new office manager for the clinic. One of the questions she is asked is does a blind person get nervous if they can’t see people looking at them and the answer is yes they do. Caroline is proof that the program and others like it work. When she lost her sight she also lost her independence and her self confidence. But because of organizations like Lilac Services of the blind and lions, she has become the person she is today.

Melissa is a teacher in Spokane, who travels throughout our area teaching independent living skills to people in need. She helps to teach and re-teach every day skills that are needed to function on your own. Independence is the main objective and then how to get back out there and to have a fulfilling life again. Life changes IS hearing “You will lose your sight” needs to restore hope by restoring independence. Clients reach 100% of their goals. It gives them back their life & hobbies.



Matthew helps to raise money for the program. He also helps to engage people to help and to educate them. He is also responsible for setting up programs to learn self defense, high tech training and low voice assessment. Matthew is a Spokane Century Lion.

Once open they would like to engage the community and also to have our club do a visit. When Melissa does come to the valley she currently sees

about 40 to 50 low vision people. But she hopes that when the doors open for the new facility that those numbers will increase because they know the need is there. Survey that is out shows that there is anywhere from 2 to 3,000 in need of these services. They will also be servicing the 7 tribes from the Okanogan valley when they are brought down by a bus to the facility.

I would like to thank them for joining us. I am sorry I missed the program but thank you Shelley for the notes and hope I covered most of the highlights for this program.
