Cal Ripken Sr. Foundation Badges for Baseball Jon Wyss



Cal Ripken Sr. Foundation and the Boys and Girls Club of Snohomish County along with Washington Attorney General, Rob McKenna have come to the NCW to bring in the Badges for Baseball as a program that will pair local law enforcement as mentors and coaches with youth in our communities. They want to provide a positive outlet for youth during out-of-school hours when they are most likely to commit or become a victim of crime. The youth will work with law enforcement volunteers who in turn will serve as mentors on and off the field. During these clinics they will teach these youths about baseball and also about life's lessons. During the day they will have 2 – 1/2 sessions that will deliver 12 vital life lessons to young people to help them understand the importance of choosing to stay in school, stay off harmful substances and stay away from negative peer groups and gangs.

There are going to be four clinics in the surrounding area: 1 in Wenatchee, 1 in East Wenatchee, 1 in Omak and 1 in Brewster. Each clinic hosts 100 boys and girls to be involved age 7 to 14 years old and in need of this support. They send out invitations to invite the youth and they are still looking for kids to be involved. Along with the participation in the clinic they receive a uniform and a glove. All the uniforms have the #7 on them representing Cal Ripken Sr. They will also be having a dinner at the Wenatchee Convention Center on August 15th with speakers and to talk about what they want to do in our area.

Along with these clinics they are also looking to bring the boys and girls club to the NCW communities. They are already looking into the community center in Brewster to help that area and are looking at the other areas and getting the community involved. They have also received information that some retail stores have a program called KIDS that donate clothes, bags, shoes and other things needed to youths for school. This program has donated 2 semi trailers full of these items and 1 semi will be available in the Wenatchee/East Wenatchee and 1 semi going to the Brewster/Omak area. This will happen the 3rd week in August for the new school year. They are also looking for volunteers to help

at either the clinics or with helping give out the clothes Also if you know of youths that might benefit from this program please give their office a call.

The Cal Ripken Sr. program has confirmed for 3 years and all the groups and sponsors are hoping to make it an annual event. Two of the major sponsors in our community are Ogden, Murphy and Wallace and Gebbers Farms and we would like to thank them.
